




Vila Céu do Mapiá


Vila Céu do Mapiá is an intentional and traditional community in the Purus National Forest, a protected area in the southwest of the state of Amazonas, Brazil.



Founded in 1983, it is the result of the community work developed since 1974 in the rural area of the city of Rio Branco, in the state of Acre, by a group of rubber tappers and rural workers motivated and **united by the spiritual tradition of Santo Daime** (Ayahuasca), and organized under the leadership and inspiring presence of Sebastião Mota de Melo, **Padrinho Sebastião** (1920-1990).

The community was born with the objective of experiencing human and spiritual development in a new and fair system of community life, in harmony and nourished by the forest, as an experimental alternative of solutions for the current environmental, social, economic and cultural crisis.

With time, this experience attracted people from several other places, enabling a rich social and cultural exchange. Currently, under the leadership of Madrinha Rita Gregório , Padrinho Alfredo Gregório de Melo and Padrinho Valdete Gregório de Melo, Céu do Mapiá, with approximately **600 residents**, presents a good level of social organization, with different groups and local organizations that face the challenge of developing **creative** and **sustainable solutions** for the *Buen Vivir* in the largest forest of the planet.



The AmaGaia Program

The AmaGaia Program is a set of coordinated actions and projects for buen vivir ("good living") and sustainability in Vila Céu do Mapiá and other related communities, created and managed in a collaborative way by local residents.

The program works in partnership with a worldwide network, including Instituto Socioambiental de Viçosa (ISAVIÇOSA), Universidade Federal de Viçosa (UFV), Gaia Education and the Global Ecovillage Network, and operates through a continuous social learning process with implementation of regenerative solutions in four dimensions: social, economic, ecological and cultural.

AmaGaia is part of the community organization of Vila Céu do Mapiá, and is the result of a training and integrated participatory planning process started with the Ecovillage Design Education course (EDE/Gaia Education) held in the community in 2013. The EDE was attended by approximately 100 people, including residents and other communities in the region. Nine workgroups were organized, with action plans in different community sectors.

In December 2017, about 50 community residents gathered in a workshop to review and update the results of the 2004 Community Development Plan (PDC), and 2013 AmaGaia course, outlining priority action lines and projects to be implemented in the community. These indications constitute the main guidelines for the AmaGaia Program.
